4-H PRIMARY GOAT SHOWMANSHIP

1. **Pre-entry is not required.** Exhibitors must be on hand at the time the class is called.
2. The exhibition and judging of the project will be held Sunday, May 27, 2018 at 12:00 noon, prior to Dairy Goat Judging.
3. Animals cannot be brought to the Fair prior to 8:00 a.m. on Sunday, May 27. **NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS AFTER 9:00 a.m.** After 9 a.m. animals must be walked onto the grounds. Goats come in & are removed Sunday, May 27. Animals may not be penned on the Fairgrounds overnight. Pens are available upon request for the day. **Only animals used exclusively for Primary Goat Showmanship will be released after Judging on Sunday, May 27. Please obtain a livestock release from Livestock Office or Dairy Goat Show Clerk.**
4. Primary Goat Showmanship projects are for youth between 5 and 8 years of age (Kindergarten to 3rd grade). Members shall not have passed their 9th birthday by December 31 of the current year. PRIMARY MEMBERS ARE ELIGIBLE TO SHOW ONLY SMALL BREED GOATS AS DEFINED BY 4-H RULES & REGULATIONS.
5. There will be one division, one class. Participation ribbons only. No cash awards.
6. Exhibitor must own or care for goat at least 60 days prior to the fair of the current 4-H year. Animal does not have to be owned by the 4-Her, but it must be in the care of the 4-Her.
7. Even though this is not a competitive division, the judge will look at over-all grooming appearance of the animal, sound animal health, ability of youth to lead and control the animal, knowledge by youth of feeding and other animal facts and the neat appearance of the youth.
8. Primary Goat Projects are designed to be cooperative projects involving the whole family. They are **not intended to be a competitive** breeding or market animal project.
